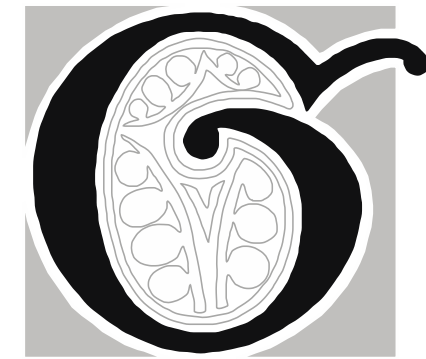

Revelation 11:1-14

Seven thousand people were killed in the earthquake, and the rest were terrified and gave glory to the God of heaven.
